MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

The Readings today continue to tell us about the joy that is derived from loving and serving the Lord in a sincere and cheerful manner. However, in order to understand this and find the source of this joy and enthusiasm that the early followers of Jesus had, as well as the Psalmist, we must search a little deeper because when we talk about "Joy" in the spiritual sense, we do not mean the "Ha! Ha!" or the "Whoopee!" kind of joy of the body. Rather, spiritual Joy is a peaceful serenity that fills our being from within.

In the First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles (8:5-17), we read or hear how Philip, one of the new deacons, went to Samaria to proclaim the Word of God. To draw attention to Philip's preaching, God worked many miracles through him, and many Samaritans were converted and baptized. The joy that was exhibited was not from the miracles or from Philip's preaching, rather, it was from the Spirit of Jesus that they received in The conversion of heart and the Baptism. commitment of Baptism bring the Holy Spirit who, in turn, gives joy, love, peace and many other gifts.

In the Responsorial Psalm, (66:1-20), we hear the psalmist extol the great wonders or miracles that God had worked in the past through his people who were faithful and obedient to Him. In Rev. Edward J. Smith, Pastor • ext. 248 the end, the psalmist is praising God for blessing him and answering his prayers.

The Second Reading is from the First Letter of St. Peter (3:15-18). In this passage, Peter is telling his followers, and us, that we should share the Good News of the Gospel with anyone who is interested, not with force or domination, but gently sharing with them the great things God has done for all of us. If you need help in doing this, call on the Holy Spirit. He will never fail you.







ADORATION CHAPEL

The Fatima message is intensely Eucharistic. Since 1960, there has been Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration with Exposition at the sanctuary in Portugal. When the angel appeared to the Fatima children, he taught them a prayer. The Angel told the children, *"Take and drink the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ; horribly outraged by ungrateful men. Repair their crimes and console your God."* When Our Lady appeared to the children on May 13, which was already celebrated as the Feast of Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament, they fell to their knees and recited what has become known as the Eucharistic Prayer in their hearts: *"Oh, Most Holy Trinity, I adore You. My God, My God, I love You in the Most Blessed Sacrament."* **Our Lady later asked for the First Saturday Communions of Reparation.** The Fatima visionaries all developed a fervent love of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. Our Lady called us to Eucharistic reparation and to console the heart of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament who is so often forgotten and unloved. We can help usher in the reign of the Eucharistic Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary through our Holy Communions and Holy Hours.





Divine Mercy Meditation - Spread the Honor of My Mercy Souls who spread the honor of My mercy I shield through their entire lives as a tender mother her infant, and at the hour of death I will not be a Judge for them, but the Merciful Savior. PRO-LIFE THOUGHT OF THE WEEK -NEW GOVERNMENT FUNDING BILL (JANUARY 22, 2023)

This is the third part of the Pastoral Statement on Abortion written by Bishop Emeritus of the Diocese of San Angelo


The massive full-year government funding bill in its proposal for approval contained a huge gift of taxpayer funds to the nation's largest abortion business which is Planned **Parenthood.** In the proposed Omnibus bill, which was approved, Life News and the ACLJ point out Planned Parenthood would receive \$286 million in one year even after its 2020 report released in September 2022, shows it aborted 383,460 babies, and has \$2.5 billion in assets. Planned Parenthood is the largest supplier of abortions which means it kills 41% of all babies killed in abortion in the US. The recent elections unprecedented spending by Planned Parenthood and its allies was to expand abortion and make sure human life is not protected by law at the state level. Sadly, after Roe v Wade, there's an anti-life wave sweeping across the country. Many pro-life states are worse now than pre-Roe v Wade. It is disheartening that many pro-life citizens are buying the lie of big abortion. Contrary to popular belief, the overturn of Roe did not end abortion, and sadly many pro-lifers have fallen into complacency and apathy. At the same time, we bishops are deeply grateful for the good number of pro-life people who actively join the pro-life cause every day. Your efforts are changing hearts and lives are being saved. Now, the battle ground for our beliefs and actions must be much stronger at a state level, working with local legislators and politicians, as we continue all our strong national efforts.

PASTOR COLUMN CONTINUED

The Gospel Reading is from the Gospel of John (14:15-21). This is a continuation of the Gospel from last Sunday. The scene is the Last Supper, and Jesus is telling the apostles that he is about to leave them "for a while" but that He would be with them through His Spirit. In this passage, we learn about the Trinity (the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit: All are One yet each has His specific role in God's Plan of Salvation. The "Oneness" of the Trinity is held together by the divine and perfect spiritual love that they share and want to share with us. This is the love that Philip shared with the Samaritans. This is the love that made the Psalmist sing the praises of God. And this is the love that made St. Peter so brave and bold after the Holy Spirit descended upon him that first Pentecost Sunday.

Does the love of God reign in your heart? If not, pray to the Holy Spirit to help you find this love, joy, and peace. Something to think about during your prayer time this week!

HISTORY OF ST. ANTHONY CONTINUED

The new Shrine of St. Anthony of Padua was dedicated on March 4, 1928, and the first Mass was celebrated! A basement church, originally planned as the lower level of an eventual permanent church, it was constructed of concrete and steel beams.

An existing house on the church property was converted into a Parish House. Crowning the joy of proud parishioners was the school's first graduation in June of 1928. A census was taken that year, listing 180 families, about 600 parishioners and a school enrollment of 160 students.
