

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Because the Diocese of Cleveland (and most of the dioceses in the United States) has transferred the Feast of the Ascension (which used to be celebrated on what was called Ascension Thursday, forty days after Easter) to the Seventh Sunday of the Easter Season, the Readings will be taken from the Feast rather than the Seventh Sunday of Easter.

The Ascension of Our Lord, Jesus Christ marks the end of Jesus' human life on earth, but not His involvement in the lives of mankind. He now guides us through the Holy Spirit and the Church. Thereafter, Jesus sits at the right hand of the Father, "from where He shall come to judge the living and the dead." This great Feast also marks the end of an era and the beginning of another: the governance of the Church by human beings in conjunction with the Holy Spirit.

In the First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles (1:1-11), St. Luke describes the last forty days of the Risen Christ on earth, teaching and preparing the apostles for His departure. In addition to the event of the Ascension itself, the promise of the Holy Spirit is something we should focus on because on Pentecost the Holy Spirit was given to all the baptized. It is through the Holy Spirit that God's Plan of Salvation will continue until the end of time.

The Responsorial Psalm, (47:2-9) is a song that the angels and saints in heaven might have sung upon welcoming the risen and glorified Christ back into heaven after fulfilling His mission on earth. We also will be welcomed in the same way if we complete our mission, our role in God's Plan of Salvation.

The Second Reading is from St. Paul's Letter to the Here, Paul lists the spiritual Rev. Edward J. Smith, Pastor • ext. 248 Ephesians (1:17-23). accomplishments along with the honor and glory that Jesus so richly earned by fulfilling His, the salvation of mankind and the Glory of the Father.

The Gospel Reading is from Matthew (28:16-20). This passage is the very ending of Matthew's Gospel. It signals the transferring of Jesus' mission to the apostles and to all mankind as part of our baptismal commitment. It is very clear that lesus intended that all mankind was to be included in His Church and eventually in heaven; but we cannot presume that salvation is automatic. Faith in Christ and obedience to His teachings and the Church remain the prime criteria.


ADORATION CHAPEL

PRO-LIFE THOUGHT OF THE WEEK - WE HAVE THE GOD-GIVEN TOOLS (JANUARY 22, 2023)

This is the fourth part of the Pastoral Statement on Abortion written by Bishop Emeritus of the Diocese of San Angelo

Lead by the bishops, priests, deacons, men & women religious, Catholic organizations, like the Knights of Columbus, & all dear lay pro-life leaders must come together in a unified effort to fight back against the deadly evil of increased abortions. Now as we address & support all other pro-life issues, is the time to increase our efforts to push back stronger against the pro-death agenda of the abortion lobby. Sadly, the president & many congress people are constantly proposing ways to codify abortion. We are up against a billion-dollar industry supported by the Biden Administration & with financial backing & support of many elites in the media, in Hollywood, & big businesses & companies that subsidize abortion travel for their employees, & higher education. But we pro-lifers have the God-given tools to end abortion in America & build a culture of life, but we need the help of the entire community & especially to reach more young people online before they fall for big abortion propaganda. All our pro-life actions must be based on constant prayer in all our parishes & a deep trust in Jesus, our good Shepherd, to lead us through this dark valley. We need many more weekly pro-life masses to be offered, many more Holy hours before the Blessed Sacrament, fasting, & pro-life prayer groups in all our communities & many more people, praying in front of Planned Parenthood & other abortion centers, for the unborn & God's grace, light, wisdom, & direction for all our pro-life efforts. I encourage you to spend time in meditating on the Ascension of Christ. It is not a time to be sad. I have had people ask me, "Because He was God, why could He not stay with us forever?" Two reasons come immediately to mind: (1) Jesus, God, wants to be accepted based on faith, not on visual appearance, and (2) as He tells the apostles in the Gospel of John (beginning with 6:7), "It is better for you that I go [back to the Father in heaven]. If I fail to go, the Holy Spirit will not come to you." Does the love of God reign in your heart? If not, pray to the Holy Spirit to help you find this love, joy and peace that He promises. Something to think about during your Prayer time this week!

HISTORY OF ST. ANTHONY CONTINUED

From 1923 until 1929, parishioners worked hard & experienced much success & growth which was seriously pounded by the Depression of 1930. As the Depression subsided, parishioners' thoughts again returned to the improvement of their church's property. Social life was rekindled when assistant pastor, Fr. Lambert Graf formed a bowling league that existed about 4 years. Landscaping & major improvements of the grounds were projects that continued into the pastorate of Fr. Aloysius Hansen. After 15 years of dedicated labor in Lorain, Fr. Rafferty's health was failing.

He was relieved of his duties here & transferred to St. Paul's Church, Pismo Beach, California. He later returned to Terre Haute Indiana, spending his last days there in St. Anthony's Hospital. He passed away on January 24, 1940, & was buried in the Franciscan Cemetery at Mount St. Francis, Indiana.
