## **MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR**

Today the entire Church celebrates the great Feast of Pentecost, the coming of the Holy Spirit, and the pouring out of His graces and benefits on all the baptized. This is the official birthdate of the Church.

Because there are different readings for the Saturday Vigil Mass and the Sunday Masses, and they all focus on the event of the first Pentecost, I will use this Pastor Column to discuss the role of the Holy Spirit in both our individual lives and in God's Plan of Salvation.

Years before Christ, the Jews celebrated Pentecost as an annual harvest festival. The word Pentecost comes from the Greek translation for *"fifty days,"* meaning fifty days after the Jewish feast of Passover. For this celebration Jews from all over the world (primarily the Roman empire) came to Jerusalem for the feast. Because Jesus' death and resurrection occurred at Passover Time and His Ascension was forty days later and nearing the celebration of Pentecost, God used this Jewish holiday to bring forth the next great gift to mankind, the outpouring of the Holy Spirit.

The reference to "confusion" in the Tower of Babel story in the First Reading (Saturday Vigil Mass) contrasts with the "amazement and delight" of the people in the Second Reading (Sunday Masses). The first is a negative caused by evil intent, but the second is a positive caused by the Holy Spirit's coming for the benefit of all mankind. **Prior to Christ's death and resurrection, the Holy Spirit was not available to man, but now He is being poured out on all mankind for our benefit, grace, and spiritual direction.** 

The Holy Spirit, the Third Person of the Trinity (and God) now takes up His role in God's Plan of Salvation. After Jesus Christ established the groundwork for the Church and left it in the hands of His apostles, **He promised to remain with them forever** (*Matt: 28:20*). This could not be done in physical form because His human nature was subject to the limitations of all human beings. So, He is with us in the spiritual form of the Holy Spirit and continues to be with the Church (the People of God) forever. The coming of the Holy Spirit on the first Pentecost after Jesus' Ascension marks the official beginning of the Catholic Church, and we celebrate it as the birthday of the Church.




## **ADORATION CHAPEL**

### PRO-LIFE THOUGHT OF THE WEEK -WINNING THE HEARTS & MINDS OF CATHOLICS & OTHERS (1/22/23)

This is the fifth part of the Pastoral Statement on Abortion written by Bishop Emeritus of the Diocese of San Angelo

A special means of teaching our people about the sacredness of the unborn is to show videos and ultrasound pictures of the brutal abortion act of the tearing apart of a precious unborn child in great suffering in a mother's womb. Building a culture of life demands that we win the hearts and minds of all our fellow Catholics and many others. It also demands that we speak forthrightly and strongly in the public square. In an era of disinformation and falsehood, we must courageously with the Holy Spirit give witness in our preaching and action to the God-given truth about the beauty and sacredness of human life. And as we state in our pro-life plans, we need to take more positive pastoral action to support the precious unborn and offer care at every level for their parents, especially their mothers. It is urgent that we also take more courageous and unified action as bishops to encourage members of congress and our president to pass legislation, that advances the health, safety and flourishing of women, children, and families; and we strongly encourage the passage of bills, that support and fund families, such as the Pregnant Workers Fairness Act and support for child tax credit, paid family leave, pregnancy resource centers, child care, housing and nutrition, maternal and child health, adoption, healthy relations, for environmental protections and inclusion of immigrant families in social programs.

These will help to build an authentic life affirming society. In all our pro-life activities, we urge all to join hands and hearts and lock arms together with other Christians and all those who hold the sacredness of the life of the unborn. A special advocate and supporter of our pro-life ministry for the unborn is Dr. Alveda King, niece of the great civil rights leader, Dr. Martin Luther King. Alveda has carried on the crusade for justice – most particularly and passionately for African -American children in their mother's wombs, and she states that the slaughter of innocence is the biggest civil rights issue of our time. With her, we advocate for life and recommit ourselves to making abortion unthinkable.


## **PASTOR COLUMN CONTINUED**

HISTORY OF ST. ANTHONY CONTINUED

The teaching Sisters had lived in rented houses since the founding of St. Anthony School. It was in 1940 the plans for a convent were finally drawn up and a fund drive started that realized \$11,000. Until the Sisters' convent was built, they lived in the school basement while waiting for their new home.

Masses were also celebrated in the school until the *"basement church"* was built. This new Shrine of St. Anthony of Padua was dedicated on March 4, 1928 and the first mass was celebrated. In January of 1947, the last mortgage payment was made.
