

### **MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR**

Have you ever had, or do you now have, someone with whom you can just be yourself? Perhaps that someone is a spouse, friend or close relative who is comforting because of the honesty and sincerity that exists between the two of you. To be there with you when needed gives one peace and rest. The readings for today tell us that Jesus Himself wants to be that person for you. He tells us to "Come to me ... and I will refresh you." All the readings reflect this theme.

In the First Reading, from the Prophet Zechariah (9:9-10), we hear the prophet exhorting the people of Israel to turn back to the Lord with sincerity of heart and He will accept them into His presence. He will come, not as a conquering warrior, but as a "Prince of Peace," and not as the evil kings of the monarchy who rode in on horse and chariots, but he will come on a lowly beast of burden. The latter is a reference to His entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday.

The Responsorial Psalm (145:1-14) is a song of praise and thanksgiving for the goodness and benevolence of God. The psalmist exhorts us to put our trust in the Lord and not in the foolishness of this world. The last two lines of this portion of the Psalm are repeated in many songs and prayers. They should give us comfort because they tell At least one member of the couple us of a loving God.

The Second Reading is from St. Paul's Letter to the Romans (8:9-13). This passage is an excerpt from Paul's longer teaching on the "the flesh versus the spirit." He is saying that we, as committed Christians, are living in the spirit and not in the flesh such as a glove is moved by the hand within it. The important point is that those of us who are committed to Jesus Christ and are living according to His teachings need not worry about the things of this world because we have the Spirit of Christ (the Holy Spirit) dwelling within us, giving us that special peace. However, for those who only say or think they are Christians but live otherwise, these do not have the Spirit of Christ within them; and they "do not belong to Christ." Remember, "Belonging to Christ" means more than just "going to church" on Sundays.

The Gospel Reading is from Matthew (11:25-30). This scripture passage is one of the most comforting in all the gospels. Here Jesus invites us to go to Him to be refreshed. When we hear of all the troubles of the world today, it is comforting to know that there is someone we can go to who will refresh us and help us to deal with the trials of daily life. If you think this is just "pious talk" be brave enough to try it. Search out a quiet, private spot and just sit and ask Jesus to come to you in Rev. Edward J. Smith, Pastor • ext. 248 spirit. Keep asking. It might take a while, but surely His comforting peace will enfold you. If you continue, you will feel the anxiety leave your body and soul. This is the time to talk to Him as if He were your divine counselor, your closest friend, because that is what He is, or wants to be for you. The Father has given Jesus all the power in the world to do this, so why don't you take advantage of it? Something to think about during your prayer time this week!



### **ADORATION CHAPEL**

Bl. Pier Giorgio Frassati, Patron of World Youth Days (1901-1925) was devoted to the Holy Rosary. "The Eucharistic Christ was his sovereign Lord whom he never ceased to adore" wrote Luciana Frassati, Pier Giorgio Frassati's sister of her brother who spent many hours adoring Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament and encouraging others to adore Him. Bl. Pier led a life of the beatitudes, serving the poor and sick with a pure and generous heart. He was a popular youth who encouraged his friends to be holy.

St. Elizabeth, Queen of Portugal, led a life of heroic prayer, virtue and charity. She suffered greatly before her husband's conversion from a licentious life. She once went to a battle field to stop her husband and son from fighting and establish peace between them. Upon her husband's death, she became a Secular Franciscan and established a convert of Poor Clares. Her life was modeled after her great Aunt St. Elizabeth of Hungary.

## PRO-LIFE THOUGHT OF THE WEEK GOVERNMENTS MOST SACRED DUTY - PART 2 (1/22/23)

This is the **FINAL** part of the Pastoral Statement on Abortion written by Bishop Emeritus of the Diocese of San Angelo

More than ever, we need to pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit to help us live each day the gospel, principles and values of Jesus supported by his and our dear mother Mary who simply tells us, "Do whatever He tells you". We constantly encourage our president and congressional leaders to show more concern for all women who are struggling with a pregnancy issue. Pope Francis stresses the closeness, the compassion, and tenderness we must have in all our parishes for all pregnant women and all those considering an abortion decision and offer them spiritual, human, emotional, health, legal and financial means to assist them with their many needs and to encourage them to save their babies. And we must work without elected officials to provide the proper aid to cover the cost of the birth and the early and ongoing care and education of their children. God created the human person in the divine image and likeness as the pinnacle of all creation. Each of us including the unborn share in the image of God's glory. Human life as a gift from God is sacred and inviolable.

### **HISTORY OF ST. ANTHONY CONTINUED**

Plans were finalized in January of 1959 and contracts signed on April 27th for the new church and rectory. It was agreed that T.J. Hume Company of Lorain would build he church (\$299,400) and with T. A. Krezman Company of Lorain to build the rectory (\$117,000). Construction was begun in May of 1959 and the church's cornerstone laying ceremony was held on October 4th . The rectory was completed the following April and the church was read in May.
