

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

EXPLANATION OF MASS INTENTIONS

Many Catholics today no longer know or understand the benefits of having a Mass said for the intention of a deceased loved one. To have a Mass or several Masses offered for a person who is deceased is an ancient and admirable practice. A Mass is offered to pray for a person that he/she may be at peace in Heaven. Since each Mass is of infinite value, requesting one or several Masses is of tremendous benefit for the soul of a person prayed for, as well as for the family, knowing that their intention is joined with the Eucharistic Prayer of the Church.

What is the policy for purchasing a Mass Intention?

- 1. Anyone may purchase a Mass Intention for:
 - t a person who is living,
 - † a person who is deceased,
 - † members of a given family (not all individual names will be listed or mentioned in the petitions),
 - † a special intention appropriate to the celebration of the Eucharist, e.g., World Peace, Vocations, Respect for Life, etc.
- 2. The Church allows only one intention to be purchased per Mass.
- 3. The date of a Mass Intention will be scheduled between you and the Parish Secretary. As there are others purchasing Masses, there is no guarantee you will get the date you want. Also, unforeseen circumstances may arise that prevents the Mass from being said on a scheduled day. In that case, you will be contacted by the Parish Secretary to reschedule your intention.
- 4. As per diocesan policy: The suggested offering is **\$10.00** per Mass. A Mass Offering may be more than the suggested offering, or it may be less if the person requesting the Mass is not in the financial position to make the customary Mass Offering.
- 5. The person requesting the Mass intention may request a card so that they can send it to notify a person that the Intention has been requested and the date and time of the Mass (one card per intention).
- 6. The name of the person(s) requesting the Mass is listed in the bulletin.

If you have any questions regarding Mass Intentions, please feel free to call the church office (440) 288-0106. We will start scheduling 2024 Masses beginning August 21st. Look for a more information in the next bulletin.





MAKE SURE VOTE ON TUESDAY, AUGUST 8TH

The Diocese has been receiving a number of phone calls regarding Parishes either supporting or remaining silent on Issue 1, which is the proposed amendment to the Ohio Constitution that is on the ballot on **August 8th**. If passed, Issue 1 would make it more difficult for Ohioans to change the State Constitution. Currently, it takes a simple majority vote of voters to pass a change to the Constitution. The amendment proposes to change the constitution to require a vote of 60% of voters to amend the Ohio Constitution going forward. Some callers have expressed disagreement with Pastors who have chosen to actively support the passage of Issue 1, while other callers have expressed disagreement with Pastors who are not actively supporting the passage of Issue 1.

Since Issue 1 is, essentially, a vote about a procedural matter (i.e., the procedure by which Ohio voters amend the State Constitution) and not directly dealing with substantive matters of moral concern, the Bishops of Ohio have decided <u>not</u> to take a stance one way or the other as to this initiative. That said, Issue 1 is being proposed in order to make it harder to pass the pro-abortion amendment that will be on the ballot in November, and which the Bishops of Ohio are strongly opposing. Of course, making it harder to pass Constitutional amendments in the future will also have the effect of making it more difficult to pass pro-life or other amendments to the Ohio Constitution that the Church might wish to support in the future. Consequently, voters can reasonably disagree as to whether to support or oppose Issue 1.

As your Pastor, I want to make it clear that the Bishops of Ohio are not advocating either for or against Issue 1. Therefore, Catholics are not morally bound to vote in any particular way. Regardless of what you think about the proposed amendment, I encourage all of you to fulfill your civic duty and vote. No matter how the final vote tally turns out, we will all continue to work together to build up God's kingdom through the witness of our lives.

HISTORY OF ST. ANTHONY CONTINUED

During the 1960's and 1970's, when Rev. George Schroeder was pastor of St. Anthony's, he had a group of men he called the **"Minutemen"**. Two gentlemen who were very instrumental in giving their talents were *Paul Garlitz* and *Tom Doyle*, the organizers. They could get the men of the parish to do just about anything that needed to be done. Later, *John Scofano* and *Dan Concheck* served the parish for the next four decades, along with others.
