

### **MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR**

In today's readings, there are many themes, but they seem to dovetail into the main theme of turning to the Holy Spirit for guidance in our daily lives. This should not be an allout unloading of our worries or problems, but rather a deliberate consciousness of seeking the Holy Spirit's help in working out our problems and fulfilling our role in God's Plan of Salvation. Some people don't want help from God, or anyone else; and others don't want to employ the gifts God has given them. So where do we find a balance? That balance comes by way of the two of you working together. God and mankind make a great team. If you doubt that, you should read John Donne's famous essay poem, "No Man is an Island" or Francis Thompson's "The Hound of Heaven." Both are highly recommended.

The First Reading is from the Book of Wisdom (12:13-19). The writer must have been very close to God and experienced for himself the many benefits God holds out to those who ask for His help. This whole passage is true and sincere Wisdom. From this we should learn that only by understanding and working at our relationship with God can we be happy and safe in His hands.

**The Responsorial Psalm** (86:5-16) picks up the same theme of God's abundant love, mercy and forgiveness; and rightly so. However, we should not forget that He is also perfect in justice, which requires punishment for wrongdoing - again, that balance. Today, we have a tendency to think of God as "all loving," but we forget that balance requires justice.

The Second Reading is from St. Paul's Letter to the Romans (8:26-27). Here we return to the theme of the Holy Spirit helping us. Although Paul is talking about prayer in this passage, he implies that we need to seek the Spirit's help in all things. This is the Holy Spirit's role and we should call upon Him for guidance and direction.

**The Gospel Reading is from Matthew** (13:24-43). In this long passage, Jesus gives us three parables, each having the elements of planting, growth and harvesting or reaping the benefits of one's work. This confuses the disciples, who ask for an explanation, which Jesus gives in private. We should review this part of the reading often because it reminds us that at some point in time, "The Son of man will send His angels to collect, out of His kingdom, all who cause others to sin and all evildoers, and will throw them into the fiery furnace."

We know that God is kind and merciful, and full of love, but there comes a time when that balance must be obtained. We cannot assume that God will forgive our sins or "little white lies" without punishment. So, call on the Holy Spirit today to help you in seeking balance in your spiritual, as well as temporal life. Something to think about during your prayer time this week!



How can anyone possibly insist that the value of an unborn baby is to be determined by whether a mother wants him or her at any given time? To use being wanted by someone as a measure of whether a human life is allowed to live is a truly frightening concept. Its converse logically awaits us--- that the unwanted can be eliminated. *Don't forget that Hitler's Germany was ideal for wanted Aryans*.

To make sense, the slogan: "Every child a wanted child" has to be completed "and if not wanted, aborted." To complete the sentence removes the mask from this misleading slogan and reveals it for the evil that it is!

### **INFORMATION REGARDING ISSUE 1**

The Diocese has been receiving a number of phone calls regarding Parishes either supporting or remaining silent on Issue 1, which is the proposed amendment to the Ohio Constitution that is on the ballot on **August 8th**. If passed, Issue 1 would make it more difficult for Ohioans to change the State Constitution. Currently, it takes a simple majority vote of voters to pass a change to the Constitution. The amendment proposes to change the constitution to require a vote of 60% of voters to amend the Ohio Constitution going forward. Some callers have expressed disagreement with Pastors who have chosen to actively support the passage of Issue 1, while other callers have expressed disagreement with Pastors who are not actively supporting the passage of Issue 1.

Since Issue 1 is, essentially, a vote about a procedural matter (i.e., the procedure by which Ohio voters amend the State Constitution) and not directly dealing with substantive matters of moral concern, the Bishops of Ohio have decided <u>not</u> to take a stance one way or the other as to this initiative. That said, Issue 1 is being proposed in order to make it harder to pass the pro-abortion amendment that will be on the ballot in November, and which the Bishops of Ohio are strongly opposing. Of course, making it harder to pass Constitutional amendments in the future will also have the effect of making it more difficult to pass pro-life or other amendments to the Ohio Constitution that the Church might wish to support in the future. Consequently, voters can reasonably disagree as to whether to support or oppose Issue 1.

As your Pastor, I want to make it clear that **the Bishops of Ohio are not advocating either for or against Issue 1. Therefore, Catholics are not morally bound to vote in any particular way.** Regardless of what you think about the proposed amendment, I encourage all of you to fulfill your civic duty and vote. No matter how the final vote tally turns out, we will all continue to work together to build up God's kingdom through the witness of our lives.
