

### **MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR**

One of the common hurdles facing every Parish is the need for ministers at Mass. Catholics rarely consider the necessary elements for a liturgy. They may consider the need for a Priest, but not all the other ministers that help a Mass to happen. Environment ministers who decorate the Church in seasonal beauty. Ushers who help parishioners with directions, seating, and collections. Sacristans who set up for the Mass, and ensure the Priest has everything he needs for a valid Mass. Lectors who beautifully proclaim the readings so that parishioners can reflect on God's word. Servers who assist the Priest at Mass, helping to make sure the liturgy runs smoothly. Eucharistic Ministers who help distribute the Blessed Sacrament. Music ministers who enhance the Mass through songs and Mass responses. All these people help to provide a spiritually uplifting experience for our community. Sadly, however, the number of people fulfilling these essential roles at St. Anthony is Therefore, after communion dwindling rapidly. starting next week, members of these liturgical groups will be speaking to you about these important ministries, and how you as faithful Catholics can become a part of them.

### PRO-LIFE THOUGHT OF THE WEEK - CATHOLIC SUPPORT FOR WOMEN


Our state is facing a change to the constitution that threatens pregnant women and preborn children. Just as Jesus defended vulnerable women, the Catholic Church in Ohio stands in radical solidarity with pregnant women and those affected by abortion through various ministries:

- ~ **Walking with Moms in Need** Offers material resources such as clothing, food, and baby supplies, and personal accompaniment to pregnant women
- Catholic Charities Sponsors educational programs for expecting mothers and fathers and accompanies families into parenting; Supports families with programs related to housing, food insecurity, and other needs
- ~ **Project Rachel** Provides confidential post-abortive healing to women and men affected by abortion

The Catholic Church in Ohio also advocates for the needs of mothers, children, and families. The Catholic voice in public policy has helped build a culture of life in Ohio by eliminating sales tax on baby products, investing money in housing for pregnant women, extending a cash assistance program through all months of pregnancy, and creating a new doula program to address infant and maternal mortality rates. As Catholics, we must support women and children in need by **Voting NO on Issue 1.** 

### **HISTORY OF ST. ANTHONY CONTINUED**

St. Anthony's Golden Jubilee Celebrations had been initiated during Fr. Dominic's tenure and committees were formed to carry out the extensive preparation and plans for the event. Many hours were spent planning and preparing. **The main Jubilee Mass was celebrated on June 10, 1973.** Also in 1973, a hard-covered history book of the parish was published: <u>A Sharing Community: St. Antony of Padua, Lorain, Ohio.</u> It was, Fr. Pius Poff who led the Golden Jubilee. **Father Pius continued as pastor until August of 1976, when Fr. Gerard Herman was appointed.**
