MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

How intense the joy of a parent whose child has wandered off, but is eventually found, safe and sound! For a spiritual shepherd, the joy of saving one sinful and lost soul is beyond description. An American Franciscan priest, Father Sixtus O'Connor, had the privilege of saving the soul of more than one of the Nazi war criminals condemned at the Nuremberg Trials of 1946.

According to the National Catholic News Service, Fr. O'Connor, who had been a parish priest in Manhattan, New York, served during World War II as a U.S. Army chaplain in Germany. He had studied earlier in universities there and spoke German fluently. Certainly, it was because of this fluency with the German language that he was retained in service after the close of the war, and assigned as chaplain to the Nazi war-criminals imprisoned in the Nuremberg jail while they awaited trial. The prisoners came to respect this man of God because of his realism, faith, serenity, and compassion.

Among the prisoners were men who had held high positions in the Third Reich: Baldur von Schirach, head of the Hitler Youth; Hans Fritzsche, deputy minister of propaganda; Hans Frank, Governor of Nazi-held Poland; and Ernst Kaltenbrunner, who oversaw the Through prayer and patient Austrian Gestapo. discussion, Fr. Sixtus had the happiness of changing the hearts of these four major leaders. Von Schirach, a lapsed Catholic, sentenced to 20 years in prison, returned to devout Catholicism. Herr Fritzche lived to praise the priest in his memoirs. Kaltenbrunner was grateful for the priest's defense when the Allied officials called him a total liar. He and Hans Frank made peace with God before they were executed. Frank, bound for the gallows, offered his life in atonement for his sins. What must have been Fr. O'Connor's gratitude to God at that moment. And on the day that Hans Frank died contrite, how great must have been the "joy in heaven."


ADORATION CHAPEL

PRO-LIFE THOUGHT OF THE WEEK -DO NOT CONFORM YOURSELF TO THIS AGE

St Paul tells us, "Do not conform yourself to this age but ...discern...what is good and pleasing..." Since Roe v. Wade, around 63 million innocent children have lost their God-given right to live. An entire class of persons, children in the womb, have been relegated to the status of "chattel", personal property, who can be disposed of by those more powerful than they. They have no power to resist. They are subject to abuse and destruction by those with more power, namely the power of the State. They have no voice that can be heard except our own. Without doubt, the killing of innocent children in the womb is the pre-eminent moral evil of our age. It is for this reason that we must "not conform" to this grave injustice. As St Paul tells us, we must instead stand on the side of truth and justice and "what is good and pleasing to God". We must recognize what both medical science and natural justice tell us: children in the womb are human persons with an inalienable right to life. Undoubtedly, the most important human rights issue of our age is to protect our "first neighbors" ----children in the womb. The womb is the "first home" of the whole human race and standing up for them is a matter of solidarity with our neighbor and love for the poor. We should not stand by while thousands of children every day are evicted and killed! **Our** call (as St Paul reminds us) is to replace the current culture of death with a new culture of life and a civilization of love.

HISTORY OF ST. ANTHONY CONTINUED

The new pastor, Fr. Dominic Manion, arrived at St. Anthony's on January 29, 1970. Parish activities remained in full swing as did nature yet, once again, the eroding beach front became a threat to the church property. A priority project was the building of a break wall to retain the lake bank and to protect the parish property from Lake Erie waves. About \$100,000.00 was spent on this three- hundred-foot long wall.
