



PRO-LIFE THOUGHT OF THE WEEK - ISSUE 1 THREATENS FAMILIES

Our Catholic faith teaches that <u>parents have a duty to protect & care for their children</u>. These duties are the reason that parents have special rights regarding the education and welfare of children. A constitutional amendment on the ballot in this election would threaten a parent's ability to protect & care for their children. Catholics must Vote NO on Issue 1 & Issue 2 because...

All the baked goods will be plated on ceramic Christmas plates or holiday novelty items!


