

### **MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR**

In 79 A.D. the volcano Vesuvius, which rises just off the Bay of Naples, Italy, erupted violently and destroyed Pompeii, a city of 20,000 people. Much of the city was excavated in the nineteenth century, but archeologists are still uncovering certain neighborhoods. Sometimes the volcanic ash simply buried victims alive. Their bones have long since turned to dust, but the ash in many cases formed a firm mold around them capturing the moment of their death; and by filling the mold with plaster, the excavators can obtain perfect images of those who died in the anguish of the disaster.

In 1949, archeologists reproduced a startling cast of one of the Pompeian victims. He lay face down as if death had taken him completely unawares. In one hand was a small crowbar. In the other, clasped tight in his fist, were several gold coins. To all appearances he was a thief who had taken advantage of the confusion of others to break into a building and rob the owner. The gold had done him little good.



Father Tom Smith came to St. Anthony Parish as pastor in August of 1985. He served until Fr. Christian Moore was assigned to lead in February of 1991. It was with Fr. Christian's guidance that the Mario Ross Recreation Center, named for a former associate who was killed after leaving St. Anthony's, was built. It should be noted that Tom O'Doherty was mostly in change of this planning, but died shortly before groundbreaking. Fred Churchill was also deeply involved in the development of the center before his death.
