

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

A minister was completing a temperance sermon. With great emphasis he said, "If I had all the beer in the world, I'd take it and pour it into the river."

With even greater emphasis he said, "And if I had all the wine in the world, I'd take it and pour it into the river."

And then finally, shaking his fist in the air, he said, "And if I had all the whiskey in the world, I'd take it and pour it into the river."

Then, with the sermon complete, he sat down.

The song leader stood very cautiously and announced with a smile, nearly laughing, "And for our closing song, let us sing Hymn #365, 'Shall We Gather at the River."

This joke, sent to me by a parishioner, suggests tongue-in-cheek that the river is where we should go. Certainly, in our Gospel, the Jordan River had become the place to be for all those who heard John the Baptist's call to repentance and sought baptism. Even Jesus finds himself with John on the riverbank. John testifies that Jesus is the Son of God who has come to baptize with the Holy Spirit. He came to remove our sins by offering his life in exchange for our eternal life. In turn, he calls us to be his disciples so that we can proclaim the Gospel in our lives. As we reflect on our discipleship, how are you doing proclaiming Christ by the witness of our life?






ADORATION CHAPEL
