

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

The Sacrament of Reconciliation During Lent

Lent is the traditional time of penitence when Catholics are encouraged to take advantage of the Sacrament of Reconciliation (a.k.a. Confession). As a confessor for almost 23 years, I want to offer you some tips and advice regarding what to avoid during your confession. In fact, there are four major mistakes that people seem to make during their confessions:

1. Avoid confessing the sins of other people.

I understand how frustrating people can be, especially when they are close to us. We are frustrated by spouses, parents, children, siblings, friends, coworkers, etc. Often times, we can even unjustly blame these other people for our own sins and poor choices. Confession, however, is a time to reflect on our own spiritual lives. It is not a time to vent about everyone else, but rather a time to ask God's forgiveness for our own sins. It is a time for us to take personal responsibility, not blame others, and ask God for his mercy and strength moving forward in our lives.

2. Avoid offering lengthy back stories or an overabundance of information regarding the sins you are confessing.

Often times when people come to confession they feel a need to offer some type of explanation as to why they sinned. They offer an overabundance of information because they feel that the priest needs to understand every detail in order to grant God's forgiveness. This is completely unnecessary. God already understands the details of your life. The priest just needs to be told specifically what sins you've committed in order to give you absolution. If the confessor needs additional information or clarification, he will ask you for it. In this way, you can avoid your confession turning into a counseling session, which is not the purpose of the sacrament.

3. Avoid being so non-specific to the point of not actually mentioning your sins in your confession.

Often times when people are nervous or hesitant in the confessional, they will choose not to say what they are specifically sorry for having committed. This is especially true if it has been a long time since their last confession. They will say things like, "Over the years I've committed a lot of sins", or "I've broken nearly every commandment", or "My sins are too many to mention". All these may be true, but confession is about being direct and specific about what sins you have committed in order to receive God's forgiveness. By trying to lump everything together, you are simply avoiding being honest with yourself, your confessor, and God. Further, if you don't confess specific sins, then the priest cannot grant you absolution, because he doesn't know specifically what you are asking forgiveness for. The fact is there is nothing you have done that will shock, anger, or dismay your confessor. The priest is there to offer you God's forgiveness, and therefore there is no reason you shouldn't be completely honest.

4. Avoid confessing your emotions.

This area is a big issue for many people coming to confession, because people today seem to confuse sins and emotions. Sins are concrete actions (or omissions) that we have chosen to commit. Therefore please avoid confessing things like anger, frustration, impatience, etc. because they are not sins. Even though these emotions may lead us into the occasion of sin, or lead us to temptation to sin, they themselves are not sinful. It is choosing to act out wrongly because of our emotion that is sinful. Also, just because you "feel bad" about something doesn't necessarily mean you have sinned. For example, you may feel bad that you had to scold your child about not touching a hot stove, but that doesn't mean you have sinned (in fact, it means you are a good parent!).



1ST SUNDAY OF LENT

Bonus Tip: If you have a bad memory, or you are nervous, write down your sins



By using a note you will maximize your time in the confessional, as well as insure you didn't forget any of your sins. Making a note for yourself can become an excellent step in your examination of conscience prior to your confession.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a beautiful gift from God that we should all use to grow in our spiritual lives. Hopefully, by avoiding the four mistakes I have just mentioned, your confession can be more meaningful and beneficial for you. Confession isn't meant to be a torturous experience for anyone involved. I pray you reflect on these tips, and make time to put them into practice by going to confession during the season of Lent.
