

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

In last Sunday's Readings (the 4th Sunday of Easter), we heard how Jesus presents Himself to His disciples as the "Good Shepherd" which is an easy way of describing a leader who is thoughtful, loving, and protective. Today, the 5th Sunday of the Easter Season, we have another symbolic image of Jesus - that of a living, growing and nourishing vine. Those of you who garden regularly will understand the meaning. For those of you who do not, our hope is that you will take the time to learn what this is all about.

The First Reading is from the Acts of the Apostles (9:26-31). Here we learn about an incident in the amazing life of Saul of Tarsus, later to become the great St. Paul. He was not one of the original apostles; rather, he was later drafted into that group by Jesus Himself. At first, the apostles were leery of him; but they soon learned how Jesus was to use him to "grow" the Church in the land of the Gentiles.

The Responsorial Psalm is (22:26b-32). This Psalm is a continuation of the one that Jesus cries out from the cross that begins with those immortal words: "My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?" Today we read or hear the second part of this Psalm, the victory over death. It is a reflection on the resurrection and an assurance that Jesus Christ is risen and still lives among us.

The Second Reading is from the First letter of John (1 John 3:18-24). The opening lines of this passage refer to the sincerity of a loving heart, not a romantic infatuation. If our heart or conscience is free of anxiety, then we will know that we love God and our neighbor in the way we were meant to (the greatest Commandment). The last sentence of this passage speaks for itself. Read it again and see how it fits into the theme of the vine.

The Gospel Reading from John (15:1-8) is a great metaphor where Jesus compares Himself to a vine, perhaps a grape vine, where the harvest master, God the Father, prunes the branches in the winter preparing for the spring growth and the summer harvest. If we are truly disciples of Jesus, we won't mind this occasional pruning because it is for our own good. It is the new growth that produces the best grapes.

All the readings for today are concerned with belonging, nourishment and appreciation, something that we are all in need of. Life revolves around these needs and desires. Many people search high and low for them but do not find them. How sad because they are within our reach if we look in the right place, and that is in our own heart. These precious gifts are not "out there." They must come from within us when, and only when, we are connected to the "vine," Jesus Himself. So, you might give some thought to whether or not you are connected to Jesus and if not, why not? Something to think about during your prayer time this week!




ADORATION CHAPEL

"The life of mamma (St. Gianna Beretta Molla, wife, mother, doctor, Italy, 1922-1962) was an act and a perennial action os faith and charity; it was a non-stop search for the will of God for every decision and for every work with prayer and meditation, Holy Mass and the Eucharist," explained St. Gianna's husband to their children after her death.

St. Louis Marie de Montfort, priest, missionary, Marian devotee, France (1673-1716), used to remain after Holy Mass for thanksgiving at least a half hour, and he would not permit any need or assignment to serve as a reason for omitting it. He said, "I would not give up this hour of thanksgiving even for an hour of Paradise."

"It was St. Catherine of Siena's, (Virgin, Doctor of the Church, Patroness of Italy, 1347-1380) tremendous love of Jesus in the Eucharist that allowed her to go out to the poor and especially the very ill to administer to them as she did. Wasn't this the Eucharistic spirituality that Mother Teresa of Calcutta lived out too - so that she could pick up the dying from the gutters of the slums, carry them to one of her clinics and care for them until they either got better or died with dignity? Love and devotion to Jesus in the Eucharist does that. They took very seriously the words of Jesus in Matthew 25: 'Whatever you do for the least of my brethren you do unto me'" (v. 40)

Many of the people who are opposed to abortion have been led to believe they should not "*impose*" their morality on others.


Think about this:
