

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Because we are nearing the end of the Easter Season, the Readings for today explore the mystery of Jesus, the Risen Lord and God of all. The summation of all that Jesus is, His ministry and mission are given to us today in one word - LOVE. Now. everything has а beginning or source except God Himself. Therefore, God is the source of all that is good, all that is created and all that is holy. From this, John tells us that "God is love itself." It was for this reason that He created mankind so that He could share His love and His entire being with us.

The First Reading is from the Acts of the Apostles (10:25-48). In this story, we hear how Peter had to learn that God's love for His chosen people has now moved beyond the Jewish people to all who believe in Jesus and are baptized in His name. One of the aspects of "love" is that it cannot be contained or limited; it must be shared and, as it is shared, it expands beyond its original limits.

The Responsorial Psalm is (98:1-4). This is a prayer of praise; giving glory to God for all that he has done, primarily in defense of His people. Today, we look upon this Psalm as a victory prayer. God has given to mankind the greatest of all gifts, the greatest expression of love — that of Salvation, Redemption and Eternal life, through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

The Second Reading is from the First letter of John (1 John 4:7-10). While we are reading or hearing this beautiful passage from John the Evangelist, we must keep in mind that "love" is more than a romantic feeling; and it extends beyond our natural emotions. "Love" is a decision that we must consciously make to respect, forgive, help, feed and/or nourish our family, friends, and neighbors. Because, when we do these things, we do them to or for Jesus Christ Himself. This is how love is shared among believers. To "like or dislike" something is only an emotion. Love is a decision!

The Gospel Reading is from the Gospel of John (15:9-17) and is a continuation of last week's gospel wherein Jesus compares Himself to a living vine and insists that we must "live in" or be attached to Him or we shall die, spiritually speaking. Next Sunday's Gospel expands upon that theme of remaining in Him so that He can nourish us with His love, which comes from the Father. He then goes on to say that it is not our love that generates this love from the Father; rather, it is God who loves us first and by sharing this love, we in turn, love not only God, but our neighbor.

Love, something that sounds so simple, is in reality a very complex force because it is from and of God. It is God sharing Himself through us, and it is something that should be pondered in prayer, explored in meditation, and protected in sharing. To do otherwise would be to cut oneself off from the living vine of God Himself. **Something to think about during your prayer time this** week!





ADORATION CHAPEL

During Blessed Imelda's time children couldn't receive Holy Communion until the age of twelve. "She prayed that Jesus would grant her wish and allow her to receive Him sooner . . . To receive Jesus in Communion became the consuming desire of her heart. She would even sometimes exclaim: 'Tell me, can anyone receive Jesus into his heart and not die?' When Imelda was eleven years old, on the eve of the Ascension, she remained behind after Mass praying silently in the chapel. As the other sisters began to leave the chapel, a great miracle occurred. Suddenly, a heavenly fragrance filled the air and a luminous host emerged from the tabernacle and was hovering above Imelda's head. The sisters told the priest and upon seeing the host, he knelt in adoration and received the host on the paten. He immediately gave Communion to Imelda. Upon receiving Jesus, Imelda was so overcome with joy that she had died in a loving state of ecstasy."


RUST IN YOU

CATHOLIC CEMETERIES GRIEF SUPPORT GROUP - 5/19


