## MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

To understand the readings for today we need to step “outside the box” of normal, everyday concepts and think about these readings from a spiritual point of view. In other words, most of the message of these readings is worded in symbolic forms that require us to look beyond the obvious. For example, haven’t you, at some time in your life, thought of yourself as being in a hole or a well without a way to get out without God or someone’s help? That’s the story of Jeremiah in the First Reading. Haven’t you, at some time in your life, felt a “burning” desire to do something different than your normal pattern of life? That’s the “fire” that Jesus wants to set in the hearts of those who profess to accept His teachings and His sacrifice. So, now let us listen to the following readings and try to apply our “outside the box” thinking.

**The First Reading is from the Prophet Jeremiah (38:4-6, 8-10).** Although this is a “real-life” incident in the life of Jeremiah, its usage here is to give us the understanding that we might find ourselves in an imaginary well of our own making at times and need God’s help to get out; but do we turn to God in prayer and ask for that help? He is always there ready to lend a hand, but He needs our act of faith with prayers before He can act. God is a very polite God. He will not interfere unless we really want Him to do so. Don’t let pride get in the way. Act now!

**The Responsorial Psalm is (40:2-4, 18).** This Psalm is a prayer that could be used when we are in that spiritual “well” and have no one to help us except God. This Psalm sums up the readings for this Sunday much better than I or anyone could do. So please read it carefully and prayerfully.

**The Second Reading is from the Letter to the Hebrews (12:1-4).** In this passage the writer of this Letter gives us a great example of how to keep ourselves from falling into a spiritual well; and that is by “keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus,” and his message, and not get all bogged down by the distractions of this world. Jesus had a mission and a goal and did not let the distractions or, He called upon God, His Father, to help Him persevere.

**The Gospel Reading is from Luke (12:49-53).** This Gospel passage is difficult to understand if we look at it or read it from a human or earthly point of view. Jesus is talking about the “fire” of a strong and active faith, which can sometimes cause problems between friends or family members. However, we must remember to keep an eye on the goal and not lose heart or get bogged down with earthly distractions, or more seriously, fall into that spiritual well. But if we do, He is there to help us out; but only if we call upon Him for help.

It is not unusual to see people of all ages walking down the street, in stores, or even in church with their eyes, head and mind fixed on an ipad, iphone, or kindle and not paying attention to what danger might be in front of them. The danger is not always in front of them but within them when they neglect their spiritual lives. So, the message from all of today’s readings is the same: “Keep your spiritual eyes fixed on Jesus”; but if you fall, call on Him anyway for He is there to help.

Something to think about during your prayer time this week.
